Forest School

Class 2 have the opportunity to learn using the outside environment this term and we look forward to hearing about their learning in a couple of weeks time.


Class 4 Assembly

Class 4 led a thoughtful assembly about Remembrance last week. The children shared lots of interesting facts, thoughtful poems and we learned the symbolism of the red, black and green in the poppies we wear. Charcoal war drawings with a blaze of poppy red hope were shared too. The children spoke clearly and confidently throughout — thank you to Class 4.

Parent Survey

Thank you to everyone who completed the parent survey in July and August. We do appreciate the time and views of those who took part. There were lots of positive comments and some things for us to develop too. We strive hard to continually improve and gathering information from you as well as other areas are really helpful in this process.

Though most parents felt school supported children in learning values for life well and several of you commented on this in the survey, a couple of parents thought this could be done better with a focus on kindness. We felt this too as a staff and as a result we have reviewed our school values earlier this year to reflect the whole child as well as values for learning: aiming high together to be—kind, responsible, cooperative, resilient and ambitious. These are underpinning our curriculum and how we work. The School Council have supported this process by gathering ideas and presenting the values so all the children in the school can understand them. Children have used these values to develop class charters to support a positive learning environment. We have explored the school values over Autumn Term in assemblies and PSHCE lessons. It has been great to see the values in action in school and to hear stories from parents of their children using the values outside school already.



Parent Survey (continued)

We have tried to vary the places we take children on trips and have implemented some new services to improve communication with home. Thank you for the overwhelmingly positive feedback on the text service—we will try hard to get the balance right in sending useful information but not too much as we know this is a concern of some of you. The website will evolve over the year—we hope to develop a gallery which reflects the range of school life in the future and share information with regard to our curriculum which we will add to the website soon.

We will look at other issues raised such as sharing more information about Leadership, Governors, increasing male role models and homework over the year too. Thank you again if you took part in the survey.

Anti-Bullying Week

Bullying is when someone hurts the feelings of others, repeatedly, deliberately—usually there is an imbalance of power in the situation too. In the first week of term, we explored the anti-bullying message with the children through assemblies and afternoon class lessons. We discussed 'banter' and how it can be a joke to one person but really hurtful to another. As a school we encourage our children to say if someone is hurting their feelings with their words—a child hearing this should always stop what they are doing—to continue would be to deliberately hurt someone's feelings. In addition we looked at the important role of bystanders in helping a situation by getting help or standing alongside someone who was being bullied. Studies have shown that nearly 60% of bullying stops if bystanders take an active role in supporting a victim. Class teachers explored aspects of the anti-bullying message in their class in ways that were age specific too—the children were really thoughtful and engaged well in their activities. I had several children sent to me for their great kindness and contributions to their class lessons.

Children In Need

The children had a great time last Friday with many bargain books and toys to be purchased at break time and treat cakes to be eaten—all in aid of Children In Need! Overall the children raised £167—we know this will make a real difference. Thank you to Mrs Yorke and the children for organising the event and to everyone who donated items/cakes for sale.
