As you know we have a positive school link with Charles Dickens Primary School, a large multicultural school in central London. Our Y6 children enjoyed a wonderful time together at Wick Farm, Frampton, with Y6 children from their school just before half term. They worked togeth-







er and chose to build shelters, bake bread (which we enjoyed eating later), create head masks, clay models or head masks. We were delighted to enjoy fantastic tales around the campfire with the local story teller Bill Church while sipping warm apple juice too. All the children took part actively and the behaviour from the children was excellent. Well done Y6 children for making the most of the opportunity.

#### Fire Safety

#### Langa-Langa Link School

Our children study Kenya as part of their geography curriculum and their understanding is further developed by the strong ties we have with Langa-Langa School in Kenya: the Y3 and Y4 children write/receive letters from children in the school and we have recorded songs to share.

We are delighted that Mrs Pates will be visiting Langa-Langa during the Easter holidays this year (Langa-Langa school will still be open) through the Connecting Classroom Global Learning Programme (developed with the British Council and the Department for International Development). On her return Miss Pates will share key aspects of her visit the school and work on an environment project with her class. In June we hope to host a teacher from Langa-Langa in our school. We are excited to learn and share ideas together. Thanks go to Miss Pates and Mr Dougan for organising the project.

#### Cyber -Safety

Learning safe internet use is a key way for children to keep themselves safe –this is embedded into our computing curriculum. We augment this with our Y4 children learning through the Into The Net play each year. We are delighted that PC Darren Peters, from the Cyber Safety team, will be coming to work with all classes in our school in March too. He will be discussing cyber safety using resources which have been created with the Gloucestershire Advisory Teaching Service, National Crime Agency and National Cyber Security Centre and are tailored to the age of children. We look forward to hearing his cyber safety messages with the children. (Beat Officer PC Weedon will continue with his Y6 cyber safety sessions over the year in addition to this).









### **Felting Workshops**

The children are continuing to explore our school values in a range of ways. Recently the children in KS2 worked to create felt art showing a value. They enjoyed working with a local artist who guided them through the process. The children loved working cooperatively and many loved the physical work challenge involved in squeezing the water out of their felt art. Some children loved the smoothness of the olive soap but some were less keen on the smell! We are hoping to sew the felt pieces together and display them when complete—can't wait!
