It really has been wonderful to be back at school. All the teachers are enjoying working with the children face to face again and the children are enjoying playing together too. We feel like a school again!



I hope you have seen the crocuses on the post box grass triangle over the last couple of weeks. The children planted these with Stonehouse Rotary Club to support the eradication of polio initiative a few years ago. 2.5 billion children have been vaccinated through

the scheme and the cases of polio worldwide have been reduced by 99.9%. Every year the crocuses remind us of the amazing things we can achieve when we work together.

Cyber Safety

We are delighted that PC Darren Peters will be working with our children in Class 1, 2, 3 and 4 on May 19th. PC Peters will explore how to be safe online in a range of ways, working with each class in turn. We are delighted he is able to work with us in this important area and add to our core computing curriculum which includes internet safety. We will use the hall



for his visit and vent the room during and after it has been used by each class.

Class 5 will continue their cyber safety program with our regular Beat Officer, PC Mark Weedon. On 20th April the children will explore Internet Safety, on 17th June they will consider Drugs and Peer Pressure and on 15th July they will learn about Online Relationships. PC Weedon works in local secondary as well as primary schools and so our children will continue to work with him in Y7 too.
