



## Remote Learning Policy

26<sup>th</sup> May 2021

Dear Parents & Carers,

We sincerely hope we do not have to move to another lockdown where our school is not able to open to all children. However, we want to be prepared for this eventuality.

With this in mind, we have reviewed and updated our remote learning policy in light of the Jan-March 2021 lockdown - please find the policy attached to this e-mail. (The most recent documents are available on the school website too.)

In summary:

- Teachers and TAs will work together on site to lead hubs for children who are vulnerable/have key worker parents/carers. This should give us greater capacity to work with children on site. If class hubs are over subscribed we will use the same list to help us prioritise - please see the end of this letter.
- We will continue to use Google Classroom as our platform for sharing timetables/work; teachers will use a range of resources such as Oak Academy/BBC Bitesize etc; teachers will lead live lessons daily and every child will have the opportunity to attend at least one a day; feedback expectations will alter a little as teachers and TAs work on site; teacher/TAs will mark work on Google classroom.
- Children will receive the same learning provision whether on or off site.

Like you, we hope we do not have cause to move to remote learning in the foreseeable future.
