### Grammar - Conjunction

A conjunction links two words or phrases together.

**ou** in French means **or** in English.

C'est **un** vampire **ou** c'est **un** chat noir ?



### Grammar - The definite article

**un** and **une** both mean 'a'.

In French all nouns (words for a person, place or thing) have a gender. This means they are either **masculine** or **feminine**.

The word for 'a' in French is **un** in front of **masculine nouns** and **une** in front of **feminine nouns**.

### Pronunciation and Spelling

When a French word ends with the following consonants, it is almost always silent (d, p, t, s).

It is called the silent letter rule.

**For example:**

Salut, À bientôt, Bon appétit !

Notice that there is a space before a ? in French and also before a ! e.g.  
**Salut ! À bientôt ! Bon appétit !**
