


## **NEWSLETTER 3**

The children have helped their present and future selves by taking part in the Reading challenge over the Summer – well done to them all.

The Mathletics Summer Exploration Journey honed maths skills through fun online gaming and real-life maths challenges. The pupil-led 'missions' involved completing

their choice of a variety of online challenges - including live games where children from all around the globe pitted their maths skills against each other in friendly competition - and real world problem solving. The most thoughtful and unique solutions from each year group received the amazing PlayStationPS4 prize. Rupert won for Year 3.
