# STEM Educational Visit



The children in Y5 and Y6 had a great day at Wycliffe College exploring STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics). The children enjoyed a maths session on the shape of smoke rings (exploring 3d shape properties); a lecture on the strength of bridges and also a session on lasers (where music was played through the laser to illustrate fibre optics). The children broke off into groups to explore different workshops including: the mathematics in a card trick; creating music using IT; investigating flesh eaters (insects); the science of vaccinations; the most efficient blades for a wind turbine and the maths of farming & crop rotation. Overall the children had a brilliant time and learned a lot.

The children joined brilliant online author sessions as part of Stroud Book Festival. Class 3 and 5 learned from Joseph Coelho—the children's laureate. He presented tips on starting to write, performing and enjoying poetry. Class 1 enjoyed a session with writer Smriti Halls—the focus was on being the change you want to see and children writing their own stories. Class 2 enjoyed author Ken Wilson-Max, a Zimbawe author and illustrator. He explored how even the youngest children can help look after the

environment as he transported the children to Africa with a story about a little girl's bond with baobab trees. Thank you to our wonderful PA for funding these opportunities for our children.

### KS2 Educational visits to Corinium Museum

The children in KS2 are learning about Roman life in History at present. To help with their studies, the children visited the Corinium museum. The children explored artefacts, studied roman mosaics and enjoyed workshops.
