
SCHOOL NEWSLETTER JUNE 2025 No14

## **Djembe Drumming Workshops & Performance**

The children in KS2 have been learning about Africa in their Geography curriculum. To link with this, the children enjoyed a fantastic day of djembe drumming. Djembe drums are a traditional instrument of West Africa. They are skin covered, goblet drums and are tuned by rope. The Bambara people in Mali explain that the name of the drum means 'everyone gather in peace' and this defines the drum's purpose.

Simon and Roger, specialist djembe drummers, led wonderful workshops for each class—the children were active and engaged throughout. They learned traditional songs, rhythm patterns and improvised too. The children were happy to perform at the end of the day to the school and parents. It was a joyous, smiled filled day.

Simon and Roger said our school was positive,

friendly and our children showed good rhythm skills and positivity. Well done everyone.
