#### In The Net—Interactive Play for Y4

We know that one of the best protections we can give to young people is knowledge of the dangers so that they are aware and can protect themselves. To augment our computing and PSHE curriculum, which address internet safety explicitly, we arranged for our Y4 children to watch the interactive play called 'In The Net' this month.

It was a brilliant performance, with lots of audience participation and the children all took away some really important online safety messages. These included never sharing our personal information with people we don't know, thinking about being kind online, what do if we see something that worries/ scares/upsets us online, asking permission to be online and how future employers will be able to see some of our digital footprint!

It was a great trip and Year 4 were a pleasure to take out of school for the afternoon.
