Welcome to a new term. Having walked the school on several occasions it has been lovely to see the children calm with learning already taking place—a super start. Thank you for all your help preparing your children.



Thank you to the many parents who have shared how much their child enjoyed these sessions and the how much they

Attendance and Punctuality

Thank you for being on time for the start of the day this week—it makes such a difference to your child having a positive day.

As a school, we are committed to supporting attendance. Frequent absence and lateness can have a serious impact on both your child's learning and their wellbeing. At Eastington, we open our gates at 8.40am for drop off—a teacher will be on duty at this time to supervise. We move inside for registration at 8.50am. Our expectation is that all children will be present at this time. Being punctual allows children to make a good & settled start to the day so they can engage and enjoy their learning. If a child is brought late to school:

- they miss the positive welcome of their teacher, other staff and friends;
- they miss out on the discussion of the daily plan so they are aware of the activities for the day;
- they miss out on the teacher's instructions at the beginning of the lesson;
- they may feel anxious, awkward and embarrassed when everyone else has arrived and is settled;
- they may interrupt the class learning whilst the teacher takes time away from other pupils to explain the learning that has been missed.

We understand that it can be very tricky to get your child to school on time in a morning. We want to support those parent/carers who are finding it particularly difficult. Please do not hesitate to come and talk to the class teacher if you need support or advice. We look forward to working together and giving your child the best possible chance to succeed in their time here at school.
